At the foot of the Cross

As I was thinking about the Cross, a picture of the feet of Christ nailed to that tree, flashed before me and I realized that there's something amazing and unique about them.

Those feet had travelled the dusty roads of Israel bringing the good news—indeed they were the good news as it is written; How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of those who bring good news, who proclaim peace, who bring good tidings, who proclaim salvation, who say to Zion, "Your God reigns!" (Isa 52:7)

Mary had chosen "what is better" as she sat at Jesus' feet listening to every word He had to say while Martha grew indignant of Mary's perceived 'laziness' (Luke 10:38)

The same feet were washed by the 'sinful' woman as she wept and then dried Jesus' feet with her hair and poured an alabaster jar of perfume over them (Lk 7:37). Later, Mary Magdalene would anoint Jesus' feet six days before His crucifixion. She poured a pint of pure nard on His feet and wiped them with her hair (John 12). Both of these accounts, although similar, indicated a deep, humble and intimate act of love towards Jesus.

Those feet knelt down in the sand as Jesus wrote with His finger against the accusers of the woman caught in adultery. And it was those feet that knelt again as Jesus washed the feet of his disciples. God kneels down to serve us—what a thought!

Finally, those precious feet were fastened and nailed to the Cross bearing the weight of Jesus' body. Mary probably clung to them as she emptied her spirit torn in despair; the 'sword that would pierce her soul', prophesied by Simeon all those years before, had finally been realized (Luke 2:35).

Yet, it was those feet that Mary Magdalene almost grabbed hold of in the garden when she realized Jesus was alive and, the same feet the disciples ran to and clasped as they worshipped Him after His miraculous resurrection! (Matt 28:9)

And lastly, it is those feet that continue to bow before the Father in heaven to intercede for us each and everyday (Heb 7:25). Let us come to the foot of the Cross this Easter and sit at Jesus' feet to remember all of what He means to us.
